You are very welcome here tonight.

You have come here, because people who love and care for you think it is important that you understand the story of why we celebrate Christmas, and say "Merry Christmas" to everyone at this time of the year; and give and receive presents.

You will hear the story of the first ever Christmas in this service. And you will also hear why it is that, ever since that night so long ago, people have thought it is important to remember it.

It is called "Christmas" because it is named after someone who came to be known as Jesus, the Christ. The church teaches us that Jesus was God's Son, and that he came to show how much God loves all creatures on earth - including you, and your family and friends. It was God's great gift to us, and that's why people started giving each other gifts, or presents, at Christmas.

Once all is in place, we sing:

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed,
The little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head,
The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay,
The little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

Be near me, Lord Jesus: I ask you to stay,
Close by me for ever, and love me, I pray.
Bless all the dear children in your tender care,
And fit us for heaven to live with you there.

The Shepherds hear “good news”

While we place the shepherds around the crib, we sing:

Silent night, holy night: shepherds quake at the sight;
Glories stream from heaven afar,
Heavenly hosts sing, “Alleluia!
Christ the Saviour is born, Christ the Saviour is born!”

When they are all in place, we sing:

While shepherds watched their flocks by night,
All seated on the ground,
The angel of the Lord came down,
And glory shone around.

'Fear not,' said he (for mighty dread
Had seized their troubled mind):
'Glad tidings of great joy I bring
To you, and all mankind.

'To you in David's town this day
Is born of David's line
A Saviour, who is Christ the Lord,
And this shall be the sign:

The heavenly Babe you there shall find
To human view displayed,
All meanly wrapped in swathing bands,
And in a manger laid.'

Thus spake the seraph; and forthwith
Appeared a shining throng
Of angels, praising God, who thus
