### The Celebrant offers words of welcome

There is one Body and one Spirit; there is one hope in God's call to us. One Lord, one Faith, one Baptism, one God and Father of all.

Baptism is the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ.

When he had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We have come together today to obey that command.

Baptism with water signifies the cleansing from sin that Jesus' death makes possible, and the new life that God gives us through the Holy Spirit. In baptism, the promises of God are visibly signed and sealed for us. We are joined to Christ, and made members of his body, the Church universal. Children are baptized in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and godparents who have responded to that love

come now to bring their children for baptism.

Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up their children in the faith and practice of the Church.

In due time these children should make their own responses to God, and be prepared for confirmation.

To prepare ourselves to celebrate these two great sacraments, let us affirm our trust in God's mercy, and confess that we need forgiveness.

# THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

# FIRST READING

Acts 1:14-17, 20-26

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

All the apostles were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers. In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.'... "So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us — one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.'

So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

# SECOND READING

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Church in Philippi.

Beloved, I do not consider that I have made Christ's righteousness my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on towards the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus. Let those of us then who are mature be of the same mind; and if you think differently about anything, this too God will reveal to you. Only let us hold fast to what we have attained.

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears.

Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things.

But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation so that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself.

# THE PRESENTATION

The priest invites the candidates and their sponsors to stand in view of the congregation.

We welcome Winifred Jennifer Mary Thompson and Charlotte Lillian Mitchell Thompson who come to be baptized.

I invite their sponsors to present them now.

The respective sponsors answer:

### We present Winifred Jennifer Mary Thompson to be baptized. We present Charlotte Lillian Mitchell Thompson to be baptized.

The priest says to the sponsors of those unable to answer for themselves

Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Winnie and Lottie for baptism?

Are you willing to answer on behalf of Winnie and Lottie?

By your own prayers and example, by your friendship and love, will you encourage Winnie and Lottie in the life and faith of the Christian community? I will, with God's help.

# THE DECISION

Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust? I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil? I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**  Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

### I will, with God's help.

### The Celebrant says to the congregation:

You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ.

Will you support them in this calling?

### We will.

Let us pray.

Grant, merciful God, that Winifred and Charlotte may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in them.

May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in them. Amen.

Give to their sponsors and families the desire to share with them what you have revealed in your holy gospel. **Amen.** 

May they know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May they proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ. **Amen.** 

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. **Amen.** 

Winnie, Lottie and their sponsors and family move to the font.

# THE BAPTISM

The Lord be with you.

# And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

# It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life.

With water you cleanse and replenish the earth;

you nourish and sustain all living things.

# Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan to new life in the land of promise.

# Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit.

### Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph.

# Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom.

# Thanks be to God.

And now we give you thanks that you have called Winifred and Charlotte to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water

so that those who are baptized in it

may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection.

May they die to sin, rise to newness of life,

and continue for ever in Jesus Christ our Lord,

through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

The Celebrant now says to the sponsors of Winnie and Lottie:

I now ask you to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Celebrant says to the congregation:

This is the faith of the Church.

The Congregation responds:

This is our faith: We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Winifred Jennifer Mary, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

Winnie, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

Charlotte Lillian Mitchell, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

Lottie, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

Live as disciples of Christ: fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

The congregation responds, saying

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

A candle is lit from the Easter candle, and the Celebrant says to each:

God has brought you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

After **both** candles have been presented, the congregation joins in saying

### Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins in saying

We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

# THE GREETING OF PEACE

In baptism, God has made us one in Christ. His Spirit is with us.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

Members of the congregation greet one another in an appropriate way, and especially greet and welcome the world's newest Christians, Winnie and Lottie.

# THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

During the following hymn, the people's gifts are brought forward, and the altar prepared.

# THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Celebrant offers prayers over the gifts, to which the people respond:

### Blessed be God for ever.

The Celebrant then begins the Great Thanksgiving Prayer

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** 

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The Celebrant continues with the prayer, concluding with:

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Celebrant continues the prayer until the deacon says:

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died, Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues the prayer, which concludes:

...we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever. Amen.

A brief silence is kept.

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

# THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND THE COMMUNION

As the Celebrant breaks the bread, the following is said:

As this broken bread was once many grains which have been gathered together and made one bread, so may your Church be gathered from the ends of the earth into your kingdom.

#### We sing:

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, grant us peace.

The gifts of God for the people of God.

Come, let us take this holy sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ in remembrance that he died for us, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Communion is distributed.

We gather around the altar, kneeling if you wish or, given we are all raised with Christ, standing. Follow the directions of the sidespeople.

All are welcome to receive the sacrament, which is distributed in both kinds.\* If you prefer, please come forward for a blessing, and indicate this to the Celebrant.

\* 'Intinction' (the 'dipping' of the host into the chalice) has many health risks (as well as undermining the sense of 'communnion' – "the cup of blessing that we **share**, is it not a **sharing** in the blood of Christ", as St Paul writes). It is not practiced here.

During communion, the Choir sings the following anthem:

Lord, for thy tender mercy's sake, lay not our sins to our charge, but forgive that is past, and give us grace to amend our sinful lives. To decline from sin and incline to virtue, that we may walk in a perfect heart before thee, now and evermore. Amen.

**The Faithful Departed** are prayed for each Sunday. This is a long-standing practice of the Church, which reflects the statement in the Creed: "We believe... in the communion of saints" – that is, that all the living and departed are held, by God's grace and mercy, in one *living* communion. At St George's, with some exceptions, until now this has included by name only those whose mortal remains are within the Garden of Remembrance. From this Lent, we will attempt to remember *all* those known and loved by members of this parish, wherever they may rest.

If you wish to remember the names of friends or relatives (or any others who have inspired you in your journey of faith), please provide their full name and the date on which they were born into eternal life (i.e., date of death) to Adrian. Their names can then be included at their "years' mind".

### Looking further ahead:

Our **Holy Week preacher** this year will be The Right Reverend Dr Stephen Pickard, sometime Principal of St Mark's Theological College, Canberra, and assistant bishop in the Diocese of Adelaide (amongst many other things). Bishop Stephen's will be presenting "Portraits of Discipleship": he will begin this on Palm Sunday (March 24), continue with an address in the eucharist each night of Holy Week, and also at the Good Friday liturgy and the liturgies of Easter Day.

In the Easter Season, we will have a series of Guest Preachers on the theme: "First Witnesses to the Resurrection: Women and the Easter faith". Every Sunday during the Easter season (though see below) will see an engaging woman preacher reflecting with us on the mystery and wonder of Easter. Preachers will include: Dr Meg Warner; Bishop Kate Prowd; Bishop Genieve Blackwell; Archdeacon Colleen O'Reilly, AM and will conclude on the Feast of Pentecost, when the preacher will be The Reverend Canon (Emerita) Professor Dorothy Lee, AM, FAHA

### **Patronal Festival**

The one exception to the above is our Patronal Festival, which we will celebrate on Sunday April 28 (the fourth Sunday of Easter), where our preacher will be The Reverend Professor (Emeritus) Robert Gribben, AM. Professor Gribben is an internationally recognised (and awarded) liturgical scholar, and the chief author/compiler of *Uniting in Worship*. (He is frequently referred to as the UCA's Thomas Cranmer!) He is also a significant figure in International Ecumenical Dialogue – not least with the Orthodox Churches (He loves the Anglican church, too.)
